Why pick Lake Agua Milpa for your Mexico Bass Fishing Adventure?

I believe that Lake Agua Milpa is the most consistently producing lake in Mexico. The average size bass is outstanding and the catch rates are amazing. Depending on the time of year you go, there are great numbers of 3-7 lb fish caught on most trips.

Look at these numbers from the trip just concluded on March 30th.

Number of anglers in Rick's Group: 12 (6 Boats)

Days fished: 3

Total number of Bass caught: 2,913 (162 Bass per boat per day average)

Size: Lots of fish in the 3-5 lb class

Big Bass for the trip in Rick's group: 6-1/4 lbs

Most fish caught by one boat on one day: 314 Bass

Biggest Bass caught by an angler in another group during the same 3 days: 10 lb 2 oz

SPECIAL TRIP!

On June 4th-8th, 2008, there will be a special American Bass trip to Lake Agua Milpa. There are very few spots open for this trip. The outfitter, Rick Treese, has been taken about 30 trips to Lake Agua Milpa. 7 of those trips have been during this very week. It is Rick's favorite week of the year to go to Agua Milpa. The fishing over the years has proved to be very consistent for Bass in the 4-7 lb range. The biggest Bass they have caught on trips during this week has been 11 lbs 6 ozs. Typically the numbers of Bass per boat are in the 100-150 per day range. While there are never any guarantees in Bass fishing, it's always good to plan trips of this type when history shows great conditions. The typical bite on this trip is 6"-8" Lizards, Senkos and Swimbaits. The lake level is usually down a bit which makes for perfect conditions. Another great thing Rick has found in June is that you find fish of similar size run together. That means that when you find 4-5 lb fish, you can usually catch several in a row that are that size. I personally experienced this on a previous trip to Agua Milpa during this same week when on 3 consecutive casts I caught two 6's and an 8 pounder. Had I not stopped for photos on each fish I probably could have caught a couple more.

If you would like to join us on this trip, you need to contact Rick Treese ASAP. There are only a few spots left and I don't think Rick can expand the size of the group. There are a few regulars that go each year on this trip so those spots were already gone as soon as Rick made the reservations with Billy Chapman.

I will be taking my son, Jason, and we put up our \$20 against all the other boats for Biggest Bass and Most Bass. It makes for a spirited debate at dinner! Oh yeah, the dinners are OUTSTANDING! If you have never experienced the Billy Chapman hospitality, you will be impressed. Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner are served by a friendly and gracious staff. Honestly, the food is excellent.

One other thing that I truly appreciate is traveling with Rick Treese. If you are not accustomed to traveling to Mexico, it is great to travel with someone that has made the trip so many times. He knows exactly what to do from arriving at the airport for departure until you clear customs when you get home. This takes away all of the stress. Remember, get your passport now!

Another thing that is great about booking with Rick Treese is that he knows exactly how to fish these big Mexico Bass. He will tell you what tackle to take and what lures, hooks and weights to pack. This one point alone can save you hundreds of dollars in unneeded tackle purchases and baggage charges for tackle that will not produce on your trip. He will also tell you the weight of line you should spool. By the way, spool heavy!
